Placing an Order

Ordering Chai Lifeline meals for hospitalized patients and their family members couldn't be easier. Call the Chai Lifeline Meal Hotline at (212) 699-6650 or (877) MEALS-77.

In order to ensure prompt delivery of Shabbos or Yom Tov meals in non-emergency situations, please phone in requests by 5:00 PM on Thursday or the day prior to erev Yom Tov. For example, if Yom Tov falls on Wednesday, please call in your request by Tuesday at 5:00 PM.

In an Emergency – When the patient is hospitalized on Friday or before Yom Tov, please leave a detailed message on the Meal Hotline. Include a number where you can be reached. Your call will be returned as soon as possible.

Hospital Meal Delivery

Meals are delivered to hospitals between 5:00 and 7:00 PM Sunday through Thursday and between 12:00 and 4:00 PM Fridays and Erev Yom Tov.

Meal Deliveries to Homes

Contact your case manager to make arrangements to have meals delivered to your home.
